THE SIND BOARD OF TECHNICAL EDUCATION ORDINANCE, 1970

[30th December, 1970]

An Ordinance to constitute and establish the Sind Board of Technical Education.

WHEREAS it is expedient to constitute and establish a Board of Technical Education for the Province of Sind, in the manner hereinafter appearing;

Preamble

NOW, THEREFORE, is pursuance of the Martial Law Proclamation of 25th March, 1969, read with the Provisional Constitution Order, and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the Governor of Sind is pleased to make and promulgate the following Ordinance:-

Short title and commencement.

1. (1) This Ordinance may be called the Sind Board of Technical Education Ordinance, 1970

(2) It shall come into force on such date as Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, appoint in this behalf.

2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say--

Definitions.

(a) "Board" means the Sind Board of Technical Education constituted under this Ordinance;

(b) "centre" means an institution imparting certificate level training in technical subjects;

(c) "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Board;

(d) "Committee" means a committee constituted under section 19;

(e) "Controller of Examinations" means the Controller of Examinations of the Board:

- (f) "Controlling Authority" means the Controlling Authority of the Board;
- (g) "Government" means the Government of Sind;
- (h) "Institute" means an institution recognized by the Board for imparting technical or commercial education below degree level, and includes a polytechnic institute, a technical institute, a commercial institute, a vocational institute and any other institution or college imparting diploma or certificate level training in technical, commercial or vocational subject;
- (i) "institution" means an institute or centre;
- (j) "member" means a member of the Board;
- (k) "prescribed" means prescribed by regulations or rules;
- (l) "Principal" means the head of an institute;
- (m) "recognised" means recognised by the Board;
- (n) "regulations and rules" mean respectively the regulations and rules made under this Ordinance; and
- (o) "Secretary" means the Secretary of the Board;

3. (1) As soon as may be after the coming into force of this Ordinance, there shall be constituted and established by Government in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance a Board to be called the Sind Board of Technical Education.

Establishment and incorporation.

(2) The Board shall be a body corporate and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal with power to acquire and hold property and to transfer the same and may sue or be sued by its corporate name.

- [(vi) the Chairman, Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education, Hyderabad;
- ³["(vi-a) The chairman, Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education, Sukkur,".]
- (vii) the Director, ⁴["Bureau of Curriculum, Education Extension and Specialized Services, Sindh".]
- (viii) the Chairman, Sindh Textbook Board;
- (ix) one Principle of a polytechnic institute, to be nominated by ⁵[Controlling Authority;]
- (x) one head of a commercial institute, to be nominated by ⁶[Controlling Authority;]
- (xi) one head of vocational institute or technical training centre, nominated by ⁷[Controlling Authority;
- ⁸[(xii) "one Industrialist to be nominated by the Controlling Authority;"]
- ⁹[(xiii) one member of Central Council, Institute of Engineers Pakistan, belonging to any local centre of the Institute in Sind, to be nominated by the Controlling Authority; and

(2) The names of the members shall be notified in the official Gazette.

(3) The term of office of the members, other than the *ex-officio* members, shall be two years.

(4) No member appointed by virtue of his office shall continue to be a member if he ceases to hold that office.

(5) When a person ceases to be a member of the Board, he shall cease to be a member of any committee of which he may be a member.

5. A member, other than an *ex-officio* member, may resign his membership by a letter addressed to the Chairman.

Resignation of members.

6. A member shall be liable to be removed by the Controlling Authority, if—

Removal of members.

- (i) he has become of unsound mind;
- (ii) he has been declared insolvent by a competent court;
- (iii) he has been convicted by criminal court of an offence involving moral turpitude.

The decision of the Controlling Authority in this behalf shall be final [:]

“Provided that no member shall be removed unless he is given an opportunity of being heard”.

7. (1) Whenever there occurs a vacancy in the membership of the Board due to death, resignation or removal, it shall be filled in accordance with the provision of Section 1⁴.

Casual vacancies.

(2) The person who fills the vacancy shall be a member of the Board for the remaining term of office of the member in whose place he is appointed.

8. (1) The Chairman may, when he considers necessary, and shall, on a requisition from at least five members, call a meeting of the Board.

Meetings of the Board.

(2) The quorum for a meeting of the Board shall be seven.

9. The Board shall have jurisdiction over all institutions and centres in the Province of Sind; provided that Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, exclude the jurisdiction of the Board in respect of any institution or class of institutions.

Jurisdiction of the Board.

10. The Education ¹[The Minister for Education Sind or in his absence the Education Secretary] Government of Sind, shall be the Controlling Authority of the Board.

Controlling Authority.

11. (1) The Controlling Authority shall have the power to cause an inspection to be made by such person or persons as the Controlling Authority may direct, of the offices, activities and funds of and the examination conducted by the Board and to cause an enquiry to be made in like manner in respect of any matter concerning the Board.

Powers of Controlling Authority.

(2) The Controlling Authority shall communicate to the Board the result of such inspection or enquiry and may advise the Board to take such action within such period as may be specified.

(3) The Board shall report to the Controlling Authority the action as it proposes to take or has taken on such communication.

(4) Whereas the Board does not, within a reasonable time, take action to the satisfaction of the Controlling Authority, the Controlling Authority may, after considering any explanation made by the Board, issue such directions as the Controlling Authority thinks fit, and the Chairman shall comply with such direction.

(5) If the Controlling Authority is satisfied that any proceeding of the Board or a committee is not in conformity with this Ordinance, or the regulations and rules, the Controlling Authority may, without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this section, by order in writing, annul such proceedings:

Provided that before making any such order, the Controlling Authority shall, through the Chairman, call upon the Board or the committee, as the case may be, to show cause why such an order should not be made.

12. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Ordinance, the Board shall have power to organize, regulate, develop and control technical, vocation, industrial and commercial education in Sind.

Powers of the Board.

(2) In particular and without prejudice to the generality of the power conferred by sub-section (1), the Board shall have the power—

- (i) to hold and conduct examinations pertaining to technical, vocational, industrial and commercial education below degree level and such other examination as may be determined by Government, ¹["and also to regulate the development of technical, vocational, industrial and commercial education below degree level by compulsory registration thereof".]
- (ii) to prescribe courses of study for its examinations;
- (iii) to lay down conditions for recognition and affiliation of institutions;
- (iv) to accord, refuse or withdraw recognition, wholly or partly, after considering inspection reports received from an Inspection Committee appointed by the Board in this behalf
- (v) to inspect and arrange for inspection of recognised institution and call for inspection reports;

- (vi) to lay down conditions for admission to its examinations, to determine the eligibility of candidates and to admit them to its examination;
- (vii) to grant certificates and diplomas to persons who have passed its examinations;
- (viii) to fix, demand and receive such fees as may be prescribed;
- (ix) to supervise the residence, health and discipline of students of recognised institutions with a view to promoting their general welfare;
- (x) to organise and promote extra-mural activities in and for recognised institutions;
- (xi) to institute and award scholarships, medals and prizes in accordance with the regulations and rules;
- (xii) to hold, control and administer its property and funds;
- (xiii) to enter into and carry out contracts in exercise of its duties under this Ordinance and regulations;
- (xiv) to pass the annual budget;
- (xv) to transfer any movable and immovable property;
- (xvi) to hold and manage endowments;
- (xvii) to regulate and decide all administrative matters, including the creation and abolition of posts;
- (xviii) to appoint the staff and define their duties and conditions of service;
- (xix) to make provision for buildings, premises, furnitures, apparatus, books and other means required for carrying out the purposes of this Ordinance;
- (xx) to sanction such expenditure and to appoint such

officers and staff as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this Ordinance; and

(xxi) to do all other acts necessary for carrying out the purposes of this Ordinance.

(3) The Board may delegate any of its powers to the Chairman, or any officer of the Board, or to a committee, or a sub-committee appointed by it, subject to such conditions as it may deem fit to impose.

13. (1) The Board shall have the power to make regulations, consistent with this Ordinance on all or any of the following matters, namely:--

Powers of the Board to make regulations.

- (a) the constitution, powers and duties of the committees;
- (b) powers and duties of the officers of the Board mentioned in Section 15;
- (c) terms and conditions of service of the employees of the Board, including taking of disciplinary action, grant of leave and their retirement;
- (d) constitution of Pension or Provident Fund or both for the benefit of the employees of the Board;
- (e) such other matters as are required to be prescribed by regulations or may appear necessary for giving effect to the provisions of this Ordinance.

(2) The regulation approved by the Board shall be submitted to Government and shall not take effect until they are approved by Government. Government may approve or disallow or remit them to the Board with its recommendations for further consideration.

14. The Board may make rules consistent with this Ordinance and the regulations to provide for--

Powers of the Board to make rules.

- (i) admission of institutions to the privilege of recognition and withdrawal of recognition;
- (ii) general scheme of studies, including the total number of subjects to be taught and duration of courses;

- (iii) inspection of institutions and the reports, returns and other information to be furnished by them;
- (iv) conditions of admission of candidates to its examinations and eligibility for diplomas, certificates and titles;
- (v) such other matters as under the regulations are required to be prescribed by rules;

1["14-A. No person shall, unless authorised by Board, issue any diploma or certificate in vocational, technical or commercial subjects included in the general scheme of studies made by the Board under section 14.

Restrictions on issuance of diplomas and certificates.

Explanation.---"Person" in this section shall include any body corporate or other body, organization or institution.

14-B. (1) Whoever contravenes any provision of this Ordinance, or regulations or rules thereunder, shall be punished with imprisonment of either description which may extend to one year or with fine which may extend to fifty thousand rupees or with both.

Punishment and cognizance of offence

(2) If the contravention of this Ordinance or regulations or rules thereunder is made by—

- (a) a body corporate, every director, manager, secretary or other officer or agent thereof; or
- (b) other body, organization or institution, every member or partner thereof, or the manner or the principal officer running such body, organization or institution.

shall, unless he proves that the contravention took place without, his knowledge or that he exercised due diligence to prevent such contravention, be deemed to be guilty of such contravention.

(3) No Court shall take cognizance of an offence under this Ordinance except on a report in writing of the facts constituting such offence made by the Chairman or any person authorised by him in that behalf".]

15. The following shall be the officers of the Board:-- **Officers of the Board.**

- (i) the Chairman;
- (ii) the Secretary;
- (iii) the Controller of Examinations;
- (iv) such other officers as may be prescribed by regulations.

16. (1) The Chairman shall be appointed by **Chairman.**
[Controlling Authority] on such terms and conditions as may be determined by it.

(2) The Chairman shall hold office for a term of four years from the date of notification of his appointment and on the expiry of his term of office shall be eligible for re-appointment.

(3) When the office of the Chairman is vacant temporarily or otherwise, by reason of leave, illness or other cause for a period not exceeding one year, the Controlling Authority shall make such arrangements for carrying on the duties of the office of the Chairman as it may think fit.

(4) The Chairman shall be the principal executive and academic officer of the Board and shall, when present, preside at the meetings of---

- (i) the Board;
- (ii) the committees constituted under section 15.

(5) It shall be the duty of the Chairman to ensure that the provisions of this Ordinance and the regulations and rules are faithfully observed and carried out and he shall exercise all powers necessary for this purpose.

(6) In any emergency arising out of the administrative business of the Board and requiring, in the opinion of the Chairman, immediate action, the Chairman may take such action as he may deem necessary and shall report the action so taken to the Board at its next meeting for approval.

(7) In case of emergency, the Chairman may appoint, for a period not exceeding six months, any officer or employee of the Board, other than the Secretary or the Controller of Examinations:

Provided that every appointment so made shall be reported to the Board at its next meeting for approval, and if the Board shall either disapprove of such appointment, or if within six months of the said appointment the Board fails to approve the same, the appointment shall forthwith stand terminated.

(8) The Chairman shall exercise such other powers as may be prescribed by regulations or as may be delegated to him by the Board.

17. (1) The Secretary and the Controller of Examination shall be appointed by ¹[Controlling Authority] and shall be whole-time salaried officers.

(2) The terms and conditions of service of the Secretary and the Controller of Examination and their powers and duties shall be such as may be prescribed by regulations.

18. Subject to the provisions of this Ordinance, the powers and duties of other officers of the Board shall be such as may be determined by the Board.

Other Officers.

19. (1) The Board shall have the following committees, namely:---

(i) the Academic Committee;

(ii) the Finance Committee;

- (iii) the Appointment Committee;
- (iv) Committee for appointment of Paper-setters and Head examiners;
- (v) Committee of courses; and
- (vi) Such other committee as may be prescribed by regulations.

(2) The Board or a committee may appoint such sub-committees as it may deem necessary.

20. The constitution, functions and duties of the committees shall be such as may be prescribed by regulations.

21. The Board shall have a fund to which shall be credited all its income, including income from fees, endowments, grants and contributions.

22. (1) The accounts of the Board shall be maintained in such manner as may be prescribed by rules.

**Accounts and
Audits.**

(2) The statement of accounts of the Board shall be submitted to Government once a year in such manner as may be prescribed by regulations.

23. (1) The Board shall establish for the benefit of its employees such Pension or Provident Fund or both, as it may deem fit, in such manner subject to such conditions as may be prescribed by regulations.

**Provident Fund

(2) Government may, by notification, declare that the provisions of the Provident Funds Act, 1925 (Act XIX of 1925), shall apply to the Provident Fund established under sub-section (1), and on the making of such declaration, that Act shall apply accordingly as if the Board were Government and the said fund were the Government Provident Fund.

24. No member of the Board shall draw any fee or other remuneration in any capacity whatever from the funds of the Board or enter into any contract with the Board directly or through any other person in connection with the affairs of the Board:

Members prohibited from deriving monetary benefits.

Provided that the emoluments of the Chairman shall under the terms and conditions of his appointment be paid from the funds of the Board.

25. No person who has any financial interest in any book prescribed by the Board as a course of study for any examination conducted by the Board or has a financial interest as a partner or otherwise in any firm which publishes, procures or supplies any such book, shall be eligible to become a member of the Board or a committee or continue as such after having acquired any such interest.

Bar against membership.

26. No act or proceedings of the Board or any committee shall be invalid merely by reason of any vacancy in its membership or any irregularity in the appointment of any member of the Board or the committee.

Validation .

27. All acts done, orders passed or proceedings taken by the Board shall be final and shall not be called in question in any court by a suit or otherwise.

Bar to suits.

28. Members of the Board and committees, the officers and other employees of the Board, and other persons appointed for carrying out the purpose of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be public servants within the meaning of section 21 of the Pakistan Penal Code (XLV of 1860).

Members and employees to be public servants.

29. No suit for damages or other legal proceedings shall be instituted against Government, the Controlling Authority, the Board, any committee, any member of the Board or committee, or officers or employees of the Board in respect of anything done or purported to have been done to good faith in pursuance of this Ordinance and the regulations and rules made thereunder:-

Legal protection for acts and orders.

30. The West Pakistan Board of Technical Education Ordinance 1962 (W.P. Ordinance XXXIX of 1962), is hereby repealed.

Repeal.
